

**FSHN Curriculum Committee  
Minutes 8/30/06**

I. Announcements:

It was moved to accept minutes of the August 30, 2006 meeting, which was approved by all.

Dates to remember:

- Dietetics curriculum discussion with faculty will take place on Friday, Sept. 8, 8-8:50 am, in 1951 FSB.
- Monday, Sept. 11, 8-8:50 a.m., 1951 FSB, a ballot will be presented to FSHN faculty. An electronic ballot will then be circulated.

II. New Business

A. Review Changes

1. Food Science Curriculum. No additional changes were made. Cheryl stated that we had decided as a committee to accept all changes as previously discussed. Faculty suggested adding FSHN 101 to all Food Science curricula, which added 3 credits. This led to a credits discussion and decided to increase credits to 123.5 for the Food Science curricula.

Anne stated that under Food Science and Industry, we needed to remove Econ 322, as it is no longer offered. On Consumer Food Science, change to "Math 140 or above."

It was moved to accept the changes suggested in coursework, separate from the increase of credits to 123.5 credits. Approved.

2. BS/MS Curricula

Food Science and Technology – Pat stated only change was to an English requirement. This curricula was approved.

Nutrition –. Manju listed the major changes.

Kevin stated that we need to change wording in the graduate program section to say "Interdepartmental..." not Food Science and Human Nutrition. i.e. "see the Interdepartmental Graduate Program in the Nutritional Sciences handbook."

Discussion took place as to the titles on the undergraduate and graduate level curriculum descriptions in titles as Nutritional Science and Nutritional Sciences (plural). Kevin expressed concern that the two are currently different. It was stated that a name change had to be submitted through the Board of Regents and that it was too late to make a change at this

time. It was determined, for that reason, the descriptions would currently need to remain BS in Nutritional Science, MS in Nutritional Sciences. This was approved by all. Anne initiated discussion as to whether 9 credits could overlap between Bachelors and Masters degrees. It was determined that wording on the curriculum sheets was appropriate as currently listed.

Cheryll moved all the above changes be accepted. All approved.

## B. CHS Minimum Requirements

Dietetics - Jean Anderson – discussion took place. Humanities and Social Sciences section was changed as follows.

- (15) Humanities/Social Sciences.
- (6) Humanities
  - (3) Humanities or Social Science
  - (3) FSHN 342
  - (3) Psych 101

(HDFS 102 or 349 was deleted)

This would change the total to 15 credits (from 18 credits). These changes will take place across all majors and options – putting the total semester credits required back to 120.5.

Jean moved that we accept the proposed FSHN course changes, which leaves us with a core credit of 120.5, reflecting the changes in the CHS minimum requirements. All approved.
